It is hereby enacted in the Fotry-fourth Year of the Republic of India, by the Legislative Assembly of Tripura, is follows:—

CHAPTER I

Preliminary

- 1.(1) this Act may be called the Tripura Commission, for women Act, 1993,

Definitions

- 2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires. (a) 'Commission'
 - means the Tripura Commission for constituted under section 3:

(b) Member; means Member of the Commission and includes the Member Secretary;

- (c) "National Commission for women" means the National Commission for women constituted under section 3 of the National Commi-
- ssion for women Act, 1990
 - (d) "Prescribed" nicans prescribed by rules made under this Act; (e) "Women" includes adolescent girl or female child.

CHAPTER II

Constitution of Commission

Constitution of Commission.

- 3. (1) The State Government shall, within a period of three months from the date of coming into force of this Act, by notification in the official Gazette constitute a body to be known as the Tripura Commission for Women.
 - (2) The Commission shall consist of -
 - (a) (i) a Chairperson, and
 - (ii) a Vice-Chairperson,
 - to be nominated by the State Government; (b) Three members to be appointed by the State Government from
 - amongst the persons of ability and integrity who have served the cause of women or have had experience in law or administration of matters concerning the advancement of women or leadership of any trade union or voluntary organisation for Women for protection and promotion of common interest of women, of
 - (i) one shall be a member of a Scheduled Caste, and
 - (ii) one shall be a member of Scheduled Tribe;
 - (c) an officer of the State Government who shall be the Member Secretary.

Term of office and conditions of service of Chairperson. Vice Chairperson and Mem-

ber.

- (1) The Chairperson or the Vice-Chairperson or a Member, other than the Member-Secretary, shall hold office for such period, not exceeding two years, as may be specified by the State Government in this behalf. (2) The Chairperson or the Vice-Chairperson or a Member, other than the Member-Secretary, may at any time resign his office by writing under his hand addressed to the State Government.
 - (3) The State Government shall remove a person from the office of Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson or Member, other than the Member Secretary, if that person-
 - (a) becomes and undischarged insolvent ; or
 - (b) gets convictet and sentenced to imprisonment for an offence which, in the opinion of the State Government, involves moral tur pitude ; or

- (c) becomes of unsound mind and stands so declared by a compent court; or
- (d) refuses to act or becomes incapable of acting; or
- (e) is, without obtaining leave of absence from the Commissin, absent from three consecutive meetings of the Commission; or
- of Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson or Member as to render that person's continuance in office detrimental to the public interest;

Provided that no person shall be removed under this sub-section util that person has been given a resonable opportunity of being heard in the matter.

- (4) A vacancy caused under sub-section (2) or otherwise shall be field by afresh nomination or appointment, as the case may be.
- (5) The salaries and allowances payable to, and the other terms md conditions of service of, the Chalrperson, Vice-Chairperson and Membrs, other than the Member-Secretary shall be such as may be prescribed.

Officers and other employees of Commission.

- 5. (1) The State Government shall provide the Commission with tch officers and other employees as may be necessary for the efficient perbrance of the functions of the Commission under this Act.
 - (2) The salaries and allowances payable to, and other terms and conditions of service of, the officers and other employees appointed fothe purpose of the Commission shall be such as may be prescribed.

The salaries and allowances payable to the Chairperson, Vice-Chirperson and Members, other than the Member-Secretary, and the aministrative expences, including salaries, allowances and pensions payble to the officers, and others, employees referred to in section 5 shall be paid out of grant made by the State Government.

No act or proceeding of the Commission or any Committee theof shall be called in question on the ground merely of the existent of any vacancy in or any defect in the constitution of the Commission or such Committee, as the case may be.

Committees of Commission.

The Commission may appoint such committee or committees consisting wholly of Members as it may consider necessary in the dischree of its functions under this Act.

Procedure to be regulated by Commission.

- 9. (1) The Commission or a committee thereof shall meet at such time and at such place as the Chairperson may think fit.
 - (2) The Commission shall regulate its own procedure and the procedure of the committees thereof.
 - (3) Ill orders and decisions of the Commission shall be authenticated by the signature of the Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson or any officers of the Commission authorised in writing by the Chairperson of Vice-Chairperson in this behalf.

Power to invite representative of National Commission for Women. 10. The Commission shall have the power to invite a representative of the National Commission for Women to its meetings as it may deem necessary.

CHAPTER III

Function of Commission

Functions of Commission.

- 11. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Commission shall perlorm all or any of the following functions:—
 - (a) investigate and examine all matters relating to the safeguards provided for women under the Constitution of India (hereinafter referred to as the Constitution) and other laws and recommend steps to be taken by the State Government for effective implement ation of such safeguards,
 - (b) review the existing provisions of the Constitution and other laws affecting women and recommend amendments thereto so as to suggest remedial legislative measure to meet any lacunae inadequacies or shortcomings in such legislations;
 - (c) take up the cases of violation of the provisions of the Constitution and of other laws relating to women in the State with the appropriate authorities:
- (d) look into complaints and take suo moto notice of matters relating
 - (1) deprivation of women's rights.
 - (ii) non-implementation of laws enacted to provide protection to women.



- (iii) non-compliance of policy decisions, guidelines instructions aimed at mitigating hardships and ensuring welfare and prediction women and taken up issues arising out of such natters with appropriate authorities;
- (e) call for special studies or investigations into specific problemor situations arising out of discrimination and atrocities against women an identify the constraints so as to recommend strategies for their removal;
- (f) evaluate the progress of advancement of women in the Stte;
- (g) visit a jail, destitute girls' home, women's institution other place custody where women are kept as prisoners or otherwise and take up with the concerned authorities such matters for remedial action as may be necessary;
- (h) any other matter which may be referred to it by the StateGovernment.
- (2) The State Government may consult the commission ompolicy metters affecting women.
- (3) The Commission shall, while investigating any matter referred to in clauses (a) and (d) of sub-section (l), have all the powers if a civil court under the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 while trying a suit, and, in particular, in respect of the following matters:
 - (a) summoning and enforcing the attendance of any peson from any part of India examining him on oath;
 - (b) requiring the discovery and production of any document;
 - (c) receiving evidence on affidavits;
 - (d) any other matter which may be prescribed'
 - (4) (a) The Commission shall present to the State Greenment every six months and at such other times as the Commission may deem fit reports of its activities together with its recommendation and the State Government shall cause them to be laid before the State Leislature as soon as possible along with a memorandum explaining the actiontaken or proposed to be taken on the recommendations and the reasons for non-acceptance, if any, of any of such recommendations.

(b) It shall be the duty of the Commission to furnish comments and recommendations on any report of the National Commission for Women on any matter with which the state Government is concerned as that Government may call for.

CHAPIER IV

Finance, Accomts and Audit

Grant by State Government.

12. (1) The State Government shall under appropriation made by the State Legislature by law in this behalf, pay to the Commission by way of grant such sums of money and it such manner as the State Governtment may think fit for being utiled for the purposes of this Act.

(2) The commission may spendsuch sums of money as it thinks fit for performing the functions under this Act, and such sums of money shall be treated as expenditure pyable out of the grant referred to in sub-sections (1).

Accounts and Audit.

- 13. (f) The Commission shall maintal proper accounts and other relevant records and prepare an annual statment of accounts in such form as may be prescribed by the State Government in consultation with the Accountant General, Tripura.
 - (2) The annual accounts of the Commission shall be audited by the Accountant-General, Tripura.
- (3) The Accountant-General, Tripun, shall have the same rights and privileges and the authority in connection with such audit as the Accountant-General, Tripura generally has in connection with the audit of Government accounts and in particular, shall have the right to demand the production of books, accounts, connected vouchers and other documents and papers and to inspect any of the offices of the Commission.
 - (4) The accounts of the Commission, as certified by the Accountant-General, Tripura, together with the ndit report thereon shall be forswarded annually to the State Government by the Commission.

CHAPTER

Miscellaneous

Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Members and staff

of Commission to be public servacts

Power to make rules.

14. The Chairperson, the Vice-Chairperson, the Members, officers and other employees of the Commition shall be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of Section I of the Indian Penal Code.

15. (1) The State Gowinment may by notification in the official Gazettee make rules for carryin out the provisions of this Act.

(2) In Particular, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such rules mayprovide for all or any of the following matters:-

(a) the salaries and alowances payable to, and the other terms and conditions of service of, the Chairperson, the vice-Chairperson and the Members under sub-section 5) of section 4 and the officers and other employees under sub-section (2) of section 5;

(b) the form in whih the annual statement of accounts shall be maintained under sub-section () of section 13;

(c) any other matter which is required to be, or may be prescribed.

(3) Every rule madeunder this Act shall be laid, as soon as may be after it is made, before the tate Legislature, while it is in session, for a total period of fourteen days which may be comprised in one session or in two or more successive session, and if, before the expiry of the session immediatly following the sessian or he successive sessions aforesaid, the State Legislature agrees in making any medification in the rule or the State Legislature agrees that the rules should no be made, the rule shall thereafter have effect only in such modified form one of no effect as the case may be; so, however, that any such modification a annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previouslydone under that rule.

BE it enacted by the Tripura Legislative Assembly in the Fortyfifth Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

Short title and ? commencement

- 1. (1) This Act may be called the Tripura Commission for Women (Amendment) Act, 1994;
 - (2) it shall come into force at once.

Amendment of Section 4.

2. In the Tripura Commission for Women Act, 1993 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Act), in sub-section (5) of section 4, after the words "salaries and allowances", the words "or honorarium", shall be inserted.

Amendment of Section 6.

3. In section 6 of the Principal Act, after the words "salaries and allowances", the words "or honorarium" shall be inserted.

Amendment of Section 15.

4. In section 15 of the Principal Act, in clause (a) of sub-section (2), after the words "salaries and allowances" the words "or honorarium" shall be inserted.

Short title and commencement

- 1. (1) This Act may be called the Tripura Commission for women (Second Amendment) Act, 1999.
 - It shall come into force at once.
- Amendment of 2. In the Tripura commission for women Act, 1993, in Sub-section (2) Section 3 & 4 (b) of Section 3, for the words "three members" the words "Five members" shall be substituted and in Sub-Section (1) of section 4, for the words "two

years" the words "three years" shall be substituted.
